1. Ask Your Pediatrician a Question Any Time.
2. Send a Private Message to Your Pediatrician at Any Time.
3. When's Your Next Appointment? Check Any Time.
4. Forgot What Your Pediatrician Said During Your Kid's Visit? Go Check Any Time.
5. Need Immunizations Records for Camp or School? Get Your Kid's Records Any Time.
6. Lost That Handout? Go Read It Any Time.
7. Forgot Your Kid's Height and Weight From the Last Visit? Read the Visit Summary Any Time.
8. See Your Child's Test Results for Labs and Screenings Any Time.
9. See Your Kid's Care Plan Details All in One Place Any Time.
10. Getting Low on Medications? Request Prescription Refills Any Time.
11. Want to Help Your Teen Take Responsibility for Their Own Healthcare? Set Them Up with Their Own Account So They Can See Upcoming Appointments and Ask Questions Any Time.
12. Login Once to Review Records and Check Upcoming Appointments for All Siblings Any Time.
13. Send a Summary of Care Record to a Specialist or Other Physician at Any Time.
